

Suicide Prevention Training Interactive video (via Zoom and the SafeSchools website) and discussion with program staff



Together on Zoom, we'll embark on this 41-minute, interactive online course to learn more about preventing youth suicide. This will help us reduce the likelihood of suicide amongst Moab's mentees. It will cover the scope of the problem of youth suicide, common risk factors, successful prevention strategies, the immediate steps a mentor or staff person can take if they encounter a mentee who is threatening suicide, and best practices for intervention after a suicide. We will pause between segments for discussion, and we'll team up for the closing quiz.

Policy Reminder

Thank you for following Grand Area Mentoring's no-gift policy. Students are aware of this policy.



1. Mentoring is about spending quality time together, not providing goods. Offering a present may set a precedent that weakens the crucial mentoring bond when expectations for additional gifts are not met, or if parents begin to seek contributions in the future from other mentors or for entire families.
2. Gift giving sets up bystanders for disappointment. If other children see (or hear about) their peers enjoying gifts from their mentors, they may wonder why their mentor will not provide gifts too.
3. Mentors of varying means cannot provide equivalent gifts to all children.

Please help us achieve positive results by refraining from presents, with the single exception of a birthday gift valued at \$10 or less. (However, this is not required. Please be discreet when giving it.)


