






### The Cost of Intervention

According to the University of Minnesota\*, the annual rate per child for common interventions to help vulnerable youth can be staggering. However, Grand Area Mentoring's per participant cost is only \$2,000. The program enrolls youth *before* they are in need of more costly interventions. Mentors act as advocates, guides,



and coaches in multiple domains. Grand Area Mentoring uses your gifts to recruit and train mentors, complete background checks, supply art and craft materials to participants, provide presenters for advanced trainings, compensate staff, cover educational field trip fees and transportation costs, and measure outcomes. This is Grand Area Mentoring's 19th year of service. Adult mentors meet with promising students one-on-one to provide care, offer opportunities, and encourage growth. Their weekly sessions might include homework, basketball, and computers. Other matches pursue crafts, reading, and talking about life. Under Grand Area Mentoring's supervision, mentors and students build relationships that usually last for years, pointing youth toward promising futures.

Mentored young people earn higher grades, attend school more regularly, get along better with others, and report being happier.

Grand Area Mentoring is dedicated to expanding the reach of mentoring in Moab. The program's waiting list of students is still substantial. Donations of money, time, goods, and experiences make new matches possible. Please join us as we:

### **Violence Prevention**

According to FBI statistics, violent crime in Utah rose 16% in the ten-year period from 2012 to 2022. 20% of violent crime was committed by young people aged ten through nineteen.

Caden Fabbi at the National Mentoring Partnership writes, "The clearest indicators of violence come from when basic human needs are unmet. Unstable housing, stunted economic opportunities, poor education, lack of nutritious food and clean water, or inaccessible healthcare services — and any

combination thereof – create conditions from which violence often erupts."

Some of these conditions plague families in Moab. Fabbi continues, "...studies have shown that mentoring can serve in both prevention and intervention roles in addressing violence, making it a unique and broadly applicable strategy."

Grand Area Mentoring makes Moab safer and healthier for all by matching vulnerable youth with responsible adult role models.
