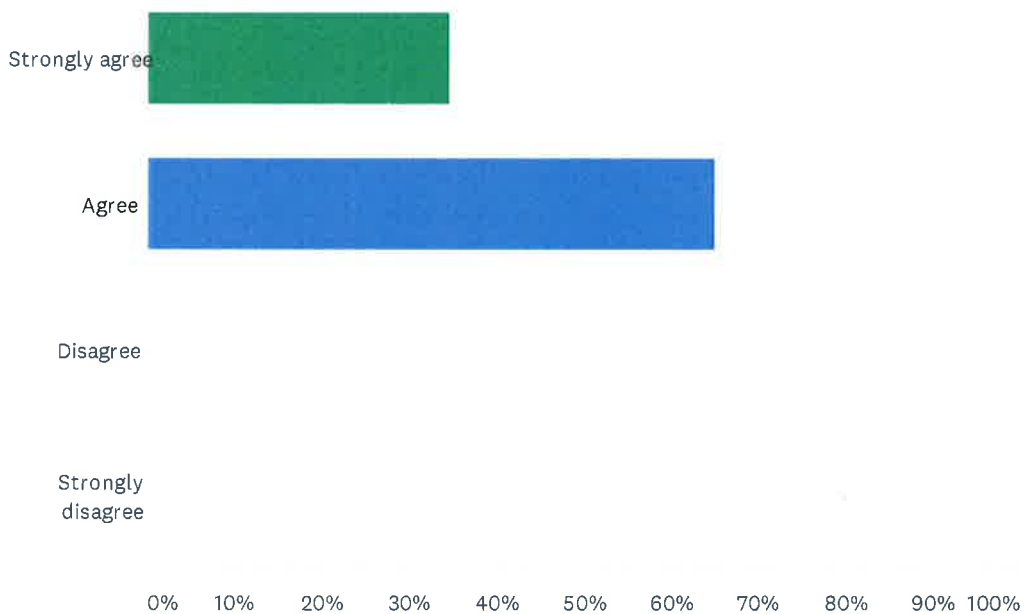


# Q1 "My mentee has demonstrated improved social skills with peers or adults."

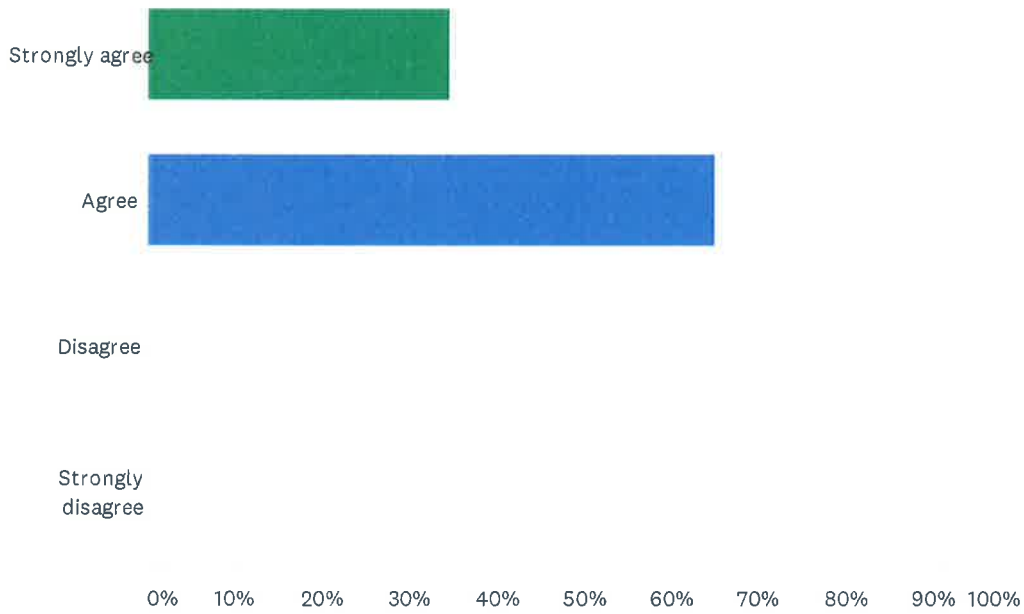
